The founders envision the Frederick County Soccer Hall of Fame as a means through which the sport of soccer can be promoted to both the local soccer community and the general public, and provide future generations with exemplary citizenship role models. The Frederick County Soccer Hall of Fame will be housed at the Frederick Indoor Sports Center, 1845 Brookfield Court in Frederick.

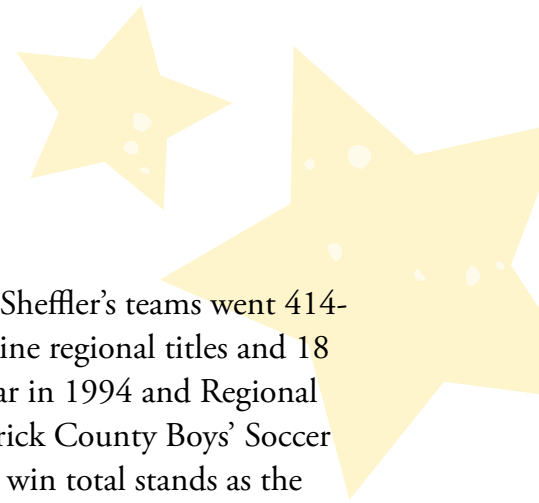

2012 Inductees



BOB SHEFFLER

In 38 seasons as Middletown's boys' soccer coach from 1974-2011, Sheffler's teams went 414-128-33, which included two state titles, seven runner-up finishes, nine regional titles and 18 MVAL championships. Named NSCAA National Coach of the Year in 1994 and Regional Coach of the Year in 1992 and 1994, Sheffler was named the Frederick County Boys' Soccer Coach of the Year in 1985, 1988, 1991, 1993 and 1994. His career win total stands as the second-most in Maryland high school soccer history. He helped pioneer a dramatic change in the game from a more direct style of the 1950s and 60s to a more possession-oriented style that still lingers in today's game in Frederick County.

BO ESKAY

Eskay is among the most successful male soccer players to hail from Frederick County, spending four years in the United Soccer Leagues with the Phoenix Hearts and Arizona Cotton. Eskay played college soccer for Air Force from 1983-85 and William & Mary from 1986-87. He helped William & Mary to a conference title and NCAA Division I tournament appearance in 1987. He was a three-time all-county and all-league player at Linganore, earning local Player of the Year and All-State First Team honors in 1982. He launched FC Frederick's Academy program in 2003, and helped coach the first class to a Maryland State Cup title and No. 3 national ranking, making FC Frederick '94 the most successful boys' club team in Frederick County history.

SHERI HUCKLEBERRY

Huckleberry was the first major college women's soccer recruit to come from Frederick County, when she signed with the University of Connecticut in 1993. UConn made three NCAA Final Eight and one NCAA Final Four appearance during her four-year college career. Huckleberry played semi-professional soccer for the Connecticut Wolves, Wembly FC (London), Columbus Ziggx and Indiana Blaze from 1996 through 2001. She was a two-time Frederick County Player of the Year and three-time all-state honoree at Middletown. She served as the head coach at NCAA Division I Marist and as an assistant coach at Ohio University, Ball State and Iowa. She has been a state and regional Olympic Development Program coach and serves as the NSCAA Ohio State Director.

MARK WOLCOTT

Wolcott has injected the winning touch in each of his three high school stops, and his leadership with FC Frederick has elevated the level of girls' soccer in the area. He has been named local coach of the year four times, and he's been part of high school programs that won five state titles between 1997 and 2009. As an assistant coach at Thomas Johnson for six seasons, he helped the Patriots to two state titles, four region titles and six county championships. He launched the girls' soccer program when Tuscarora opened in 2003, and in eight years had a record of 100-31-9, which included three state titles. With FC Frederick, more than 200 of his players have gone on to play NCAA Division I, II or III soccer.
