2016 Soccer Hall of Fame Inductees

HEATHER KLINE



As an eighth-grader, Heather Kline served as manager of Middletown's inaugural high school team. It seems as if she's never left. She was a four-year starter, four-time all-county performer and 1987 Frederick News-Post All-County Co-Player of the Year. In college, she transitioned from defender to goalkeeper at Elon College as a sophomore and ended up as the South Atlantic All-Conference selection as a junior and senior, and NAIA All-South pick her senior season. Her claim to fame is shutting down Mia Hamm on a breakaway when Elon played NCAA power North Carolina in her very first college match as a starting goalkeeper. After college, Kline returned to Middletown where she started as a volunteer coach in 1992 and JV coach from 1993-2002 until

taking over the varsity program in 2003. Kline has coached Middletown to four state titles, including three in a row (2010-2012) marking the first ever three-peat by a Frederick County soccer program.



DAN COURT



Dan Court's playing career in Frederick County spanned three decades, and he remains one of the most decorated players to hail from Frederick High School. The four-year varsity starter was a three-time all-county first-team selection (1984, 1985, 1986). He was Frederick County's high school player of the year in 1986 and a first-team all-state selection. He played for club state power Bethesda Wizards. In college, he played for Davis & Elkins' NCAA Division II nationally ranked program, reaching a ranking as high as No. 2 in 1987. He served as Davis & Elkins' assistant coach in 1992. He has been coaching on the high school and/or club level since 1991. Still, he remained a player in the Mason-Dixon Soccer League and Maryland Majors until 2008.

MATT DEORSEY



Matt DeOrsey had the winning touch everywhere he played. During a four-year high school career, DeOrsey was part of a Middletown program that went 53-3-3, 36-0 in the MVAL and never lost to a Frederick County opponent. DeOrsey scored a school-record 65 goals and assisted on 35 during his Middletown career. At the same time, he played for club power Potomac Alliance, which won three straight State Cup titles (1992, 1993, 1994) and one US Youth Soccer region title (1993). He was an ODP performer from U14 through U19 (1991-1995). In college, he started every match for NCAA Division III power Virginia Wesleyan his freshman year as the team won the Old Dominion Athletic Conference title. He then transferred to Towson University, where he started 41

of his 49 appearances in three seasons and led the America East in assists his senior season. DeOrsey played one season with the Delaware Wizards in the USL and two preseasons with the MISL Baltimore Blast.




JEFF MUSCHIK



Jeff Muschik was an outstanding high school, ODP and college soccer player, but he has really made his mark as a professional referee. He was a three-year letterman and two-year team captain at Linganore, where he holds the career record for assists. He was Frederick County's defensive player of the year his senior season and a second-team all-state honoree. Muschik played for NCAA Division I Winthrop, where he was a two-year team captain and College Soccer Academic All-America in 1998 and 1999. Muschik became a US Soccer Federation certified official in 2003 at age 23, became a professional referee in 2005 and has officiated MLS matches since 2007. His first international match was a 2005 meeting between the US Women's National Team and Mexico. He has officiated

more than a dozen international matches as assistant referee and has been an NCAA Division II (2012) and Division I (2013, 2014) national championship/Final Four referee. He officiated the 2015 MLS All-Star Game.



BOB VITI



Viti had a successful run as a player long before arriving in Frederick County, and since he's been here he's helped raise the level of soccer on the high school and club level for both boys and girls players. Viti's debut in the county started with a four-year run as head coach of Frederick's boys program. He then joined the Thomas Johnson girls staff from 1993-2000 and was part of the 1997 state title-winning program. He also served as Catoctin's boys head coach. Meanwhile, he has been a member of the FC Frederick coaching staff since the inception of the club and coached the 1994 team to a fourth-place finish at the US Youth Soccer President's Cup National Championship. He remains committed to soccer even during a 10-year battle with bone marrow cancer, which is now in remission.

Viti played for James Madison University from 1972-1975 where he earned VISA first-team honors three times and VCAA first-team honors twice. Viti was the second-round pick of the Cleveland Cobras in the ASL.
