

BRIAN BARKDOLL



For most of the past 40 years, Brian Barkdoll has been a fixture on the Frederick County soccer scene — first as a team manager, then as a player, and most recently as a coach. While he was a member of Middletown's varsity, the team compiled a 34-6-2 record, which included a state runner-up finish in 1987. Barkdoll received all-MVAL and all-county honors. He earned JuCo All-Region XX honors at Frederick Community College in 1988. He played for Petit and Griffin Maryland AAU U19, which made national tournament appearances in 1988 and 1989. His coaching career started with Middletown Valley Athletic Association while Barkdoll was in high school. He was head coach of Petit and Griffin Maryland AAU U16 in 1989

and guided the team to a state title and a berth in the AAU USA Junior Olympic Championships in San Antonio, Texas. His coaching career included stops at Middletown High School (JV and varsity assistant), Seneca Power, Braddock Soccer Club, Maryland ODP and Frederick Excel. Since 2013, he has been an assistant coach in the FC Frederick program.

BRIAN CRUM



Almost all of Brian Crum's soccer career played out between Frederick and Emmitsburg, and it has been quite a career. Crum emerged as one of the area's top goalkeepers during his time at Walkersville High School. He was a two-time All-MVAL and all-county selection, capped with earning MACS All-State and Frederick News-Post Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1997. Crum was one of the few Frederick County players in the 1990s to play on the NCAA Division I level when he joined Mount St. Mary's. He was the team captain his junior and senior seasons. He was an all-tournament selection at the Towson Tournament in 2001. Crum had the lowest GAA in the NEC in 2002 and led all South Atlantic keepers in total saves that

same season. Crum led goalkeeping camps and clinics from 1998-2003 and worked the Mark Mettrick and Rob Ryerson camps. He spent 13 years as an assistant coach and goalkeeping coach at Walkersville. As an adult, he played in the Mason-Dixon league, Mid-Maryland League and still plays at FISC.





JACKIE ESKAY




Jackie Eskay has been coaching youth soccer for more than 25 years, and she holds leadership positions with the Maryland State Youth Soccer Association and United Soccer Coaches Foundation. For the past 16 years, Eskay has served in a director/head coach role with FC Frederick with an emphasis on the U5-U11 ages. She has worked with more than 6,000 local youth players during the early stages of their development, and more than 60 have gone on to collegiate soccer careers. Eskay holds a USSF/US Soccer National "D" and a National Youth coaching license. In addition, she has earned several diplomas through United Soccer Coaches/NSCAA. She has been the MSYSA West Regional Commissioner since 2016 and has been active in several committees and

the Maryland State Cup. As a member of the USC Foundation Committee, Eskay reviews grant applications, oversees the yearly reception at the USC Coaches Convention and helps with strategic planning. Eskay had the chance to coach all five of her children, all five went on to college careers — and two played professionally.



MOLLY FRANKLIN



Molly Franklin is one of the most decorated players to hail from Frederick County. The Tuscarora High grad earned high school All-America and MACS State Player of the Year honors in 2005 while leading the Titans to a second straight state title. She was a two-time NSCAA All-South selection, two-time MACS all-state first-team pick and two-time Frederick News-Post Player of the Year, all in the first two years of Tuscarora's program. Franklin scored 37 goals and added 21 assists in those two seasons as the Titans went 33-3. In club soccer, Franklin was a three-time state champion and national finalist with Bethesda Eclipse. She played on ODP programs in Maryland, Texas and Virginia. Franklin was a four-year starter as center midfielder

at Clemson University where she had 11 goals and 18 assists during her career. After college, Franklin spent the 2010-2011 season as coach for Iowa Rush SC. She was an assistant coach at the University of Missouri from 2010-2012 and at Texas Tech from 2012-2014.



DAVE SHANNON



For more than 20 years, Dave Shannon has coached local youth teams and been part of groundbreaking efforts that have improved area soccer. He started coaching with Carroll Manor Athletic Association in 1997. In 2002, he coached the only Frederick Excel U8 boys team. Shannon was on the ground floor as Excel evolved into Frederick Alliance and ultimately FC Frederick, where he still coaches. In 2003, Shannon was FC Frederick's representative to the National Capital Soccer League and the following year was appointed to the Executive Committee. Some of the groundbreaking changes in which Shannon either initiated or was an advocate included creating ScrimmageFest, moving NCSL U11 and U12 soccer to 8v8 play,

creating the first Small-Sided Shootout, managing the FC Frederick Friendlies, establishing the Middle School League, creating HexaLeague, and establishing Drop-In Elementary School League. Most recently, he was part of the movement to roll Washington Area Girls Soccer League into NCSL in 2016. In 2019 he was tasked to create a recreational soccer organization in the Golden Mile area of Frederick.
